

The Great Ely Dragon Egg Hunt – Rules

1. There is no age limit on entry however the organisers reserve the right to turn away who isn't entering into the fun spirit of the hunt.
2. Only one entry per person.
3. Entry is limited to 1000 entries (that's how many eggs we have). We can only do this on a first come first served basis.
4. Upon entry you will receive an entry card to fill in on your hunt. You will have to locate as many plastic eggs as possible and write their location next to the number on the card.
5. Eggs will be 3 sizes and brightly decorated and numbered. Eggsamples will be available before the hunt.
6. You will need to correctly find 10 or more eggs to claim your chocolate egg.
7. There will be a golden egg for anyone who manages to correctly find all the eggs within the time of the event, this will be in addition to the standard egg.
8. There will be 5 silver eggs for the people who find the most eggs within the time of the event, these will be in addition to the standard eggs.
9. The golden egg winner cannot claim a silver egg.
10. On the reverse of the score card will be a map outlining the area where all the eggs will be hidden. There will be no eggs hidden outside this area.
11. The event will involve travelling around Ely, crossing roads etc. Due care should be taken at all times. The event organisers are not responsible for any accidents or incidents while travelling around the city.
12. Eggs can be claimed at any time after 12.15. The golden egg will be presented to the first person back who has found all the eggs. The silver eggs will be presented to the 5 people with the most eggs found by the end of the event. Golden and Silver eggs will be presented at the end of the event.
13. The start of the event is 11.15am and will run until 1.30pm. There may be a short delay in claiming your eggs. Please be patient. The event will officially finish at 2pm. People returning after this time may find the organisers have left the site.
14. Parents/carers or nominated guardians are responsible for their young people.
15. The exception to the above rule is for groups of Beavers/Cubs/Scouts/Explorers who wish to take part as a Scouting section (group entry is acceptable for younger sections) where Scouting rules will still apply (ratios/parental permission etc). The leader in charge for each group is responsible for ensuring this is covered. The organisers are not directly responsible for any Scouting participants.
16. Beavers/Cubs/Scouts/Explorers are welcome to take part with their families if they wish in which case they are no longer participating under the Scouting guidelines and become the responsibility of the parent/carer/nominated guardian.
17. A donation of 50p would be greatly received to cover the cost incurred with producing the hunt and the associated administration.
18. 4 types of chocolate eggs are available at the finish, winners can choose on a first come first choice basis. One we have run out of one type, we will have no more.
19. All chocolate eggs contain milk, and may contain traces of nuts, soya and gluten.
20. This is a fun community event held by Ely District Scouts and we are not a professional dragon egg hunting company. There may be some delays in starting/finishing. Please be patient with us. Thank-you.
